

ACTIVITY DAYS WITH The NANCY BLACKETT Trust



Nancy Blackett is the 90 year-old wooden yacht that was owned by author Arthur Ransome and was the model for the fictional boat *Goblin* in his famous children's novel *We Didn't Mean to Go to Sea* published in 1937.

The Nancy Blackett Trust is a registered charity that sails and preserves Ransome's favourite little boat. The Trust has organised many activity days for young people over the years which provide a unique blend of education, literature, adventure activities, music and learning for children between 9 and 14 years old. *Nancy Blackett* is based at Woolverstone Marina on the River Orwell and the activity days take place partly on *Nancy* herself but also outside and in a classroom with beautiful views of the estuary, its boats and its wildlife.

The activity days give children a wonderful chance to explore *Nancy Blackett*, to be introduced to Ransome's classic stories and learn about the East Coast. Ransome was particularly focused on children learning through literature and all his books are filled with lifelong learning skills such as astronomy, signalling, map-making, imaginative play, natural history and much more.

The days are run by experienced NBT volunteers and are free of charge - but the Trust is always grateful for donations. Groups will need to provide their own transport to Woolverstone marina and funding may be available for this. Children should bring packed lunches.
