Take the A120 heading south/east to Clacton. Approximately 5 miles from Colchester take the exit for the A133. The road rises and turns right over the A120. Continue for 1.5 miles and at the roundabout, take the 2nd exit onto the A133, Colchester Road. Proceed for approximately 0.9 mile then turn left onto the B1029, Great Bentley Road and continue for 1 mile. At the T junction, turn left onto Station Road At the level crossing keep to the right and continue along Station Road for a further 0.6 mile and at the roundabout take the second exit on the B1027 and straight across the second roundabout (this is a double roundabout). After a further 0.3 mile turn left into Brick Kiln Lane, the Scout Campsite is signposted. Brick Kiln Lane is a restricted usage road and the campsite is on the right after approximately 500 yards.

The Award

The Community Sports Leader Award in Archery is nationally recognised by Local Authorities, Youth organisations and Sports Centres as the minimum standard required to conduct an archery session.

The Course

The course is a mandatory minimum of 25 hours which participants must attend in full to qualify for assessment. Both the training course and the assessment is registered and approved by the Grand National Archery Society.

The Tutors

All the Tutors are experienced qualified coaches, specialising in Leader Certificate Training.

The Content

- How to lay out a shooting range
- How to conduct shooting sessions

The Venue

The Course will be held at Thorrington Scout Campsite, Brick Kiln Lane, Thorrington, Colchester, Essex, CO7 8JF.

The range will be outdoors, but classroom work will be inside.

The Cost

The cost of the course will be £180 which will include all tuition and assessment fees, a course booklet, handouts and the use of all the equipment required, although you may bring a set of your own beginners equipment if it is available.

Application and fee must be received not later than 31th January 2013

Mail will be sent not later than 2th February 2013 to advise if you are accepted for the course, or if the course does not have enough participants to run.

A full refund can be made provided you cancel your application before 31th January 2013. No refund can be made on or after that date.

What you need to bring

You will require a packed lunch but hot and cold drinks will be available.

It is preferable to wear a top with close fitting sleeves when shooting, but bring something warm for when not shooting.

Ladies are advised to wear trousers

As shooting will be on an outside range for the duration of the course bring a lightweight waterproof.

Enclosed footwear will be required for the shooting range. (e.g. boots, shoes, trainers but not sandals or open toed shoes))

Candidates must attend the full course of 4 days to be eligible for assessment
