Scotland Summer Expedition 2019

Based at Blackwater Hostel, Kinlochleven, near Glen Coe

Friday 9th to Sunday 18th August

Four years ago, we organised a totally terrific trip to Scotland and we're heading back up north for more epic adventures in 2019!

This event is open to Scouts (minimum age 11 years at 09/08/2019), Explorer Scouts, Network, Leaders and other approved adults. Blackwater Hostel is a very well equipped bunkhouse in the village of Kinlochleven. Visit <http://www.blackwaterhostel.co.uk/> to have a look around.

The activities will be tailored to the ability and experience of those attending and include: wild camping and Munro-bagging in the Mamores, rock climbing, ice climbing (indoors at the biggest indoor ice wall in the world), via ferrata, canoeing, canyoning, white water rafting, mountain biking and climbing Ben Nevis: Britain's highest mountain. We will also pick, cook and eat mussels; catch, cook and eat Haggis and see cable-tossing and bag-piping at the Glenfinnan Highland Games! Wearing tartan is optional.

Travel: Leaving Bramford on 9th August at 6 pm and travelling by minibus/coach through the night. Travelling directly home on the 18th (other pickup locations may be added).

Cost: The week is anticipated to cost £500.00. This includes all travel, accommodation, food and activities for the 9 nights away. There are just 75 places available so please book now to avoid disappointment.
